Kids are alive today because of the generosity of Kiwanians. And because #VaccinesWork. Help us celebrate World Immunization Week, April 24–30. Kenya is awaiting official results from its February 12–March 3, 2018, validation survey. Chad is preparing for a validation survey during the second quarter of 2018. In addition, Pakistan's Sindh Province is planning to complete a pre-validation assessment this month.

As of February 28, 2018, The Eliminate Project collected US\$78,187,695 in cash gifts. Babies in 15 countries are still at risk of this excruciating disease and are relying on Kiwanis to fulfill our promise to eliminate MNT.
